#### <sup>1</sup> Brief annotation of the discipline

The program of the discipline "English for Specific Purposes" is intended for students studying in the specialty 222 (Medicine). English is studied during the 1st year of study. The program is developed in accordance with the Law of Ukraine "On Higher Education" of 01.07.2014 №1556-VII.

### 2 Prerequisite for studying the discipline

Integration of professional knowledge of medical students is the conscious use of information from fundamental disciplines during foreign language training in the first year of higher medical education. #### <sup>3</sup> Purpose and objectives of the discipline

The aims of the discipline "English (for Specific Purposes)" are:

a) formation of basic lexical and grammatical knowledge and skills for effective performance of the subtest of test tasks in English for professional purposes of the licensing exam "Krok 1" and the exam in English as a component of the state qualification exam

b) formation of professionally oriented medical vocabulary and terminology in English. The main objectives of the discipline "English (for Specific Purposes)" are:

- demonstrate basic knowledge of ESP while performing test tasks in English for the Krok 1 licensing exam and the foreign (English) language exam as part of the state qualification exam;
- interpret the content of medical literature in English

demonstrate the ability to communicate in English in oral and written forms

• develop foreign language communication skills of general, professional and cultural nature.

#### Grading System and Requirements

The current performance of students is assessed on a 4-point scale (2; 3; 4; 5) at each practical, taking into account the approved evaluation criteria for the relevant discipline. The student must receive a grade for each topic for further conversion of grades into points on a multi-point

(200-point) scale.

Assessment of students' independent work in preparation for classroom practical classes is carried out during the current control of the topic at the relevant classroom.

When assessing the student's current learning activities, 20% of the grade is the student's independent work, which takes into account the knowledge of the topic of the independent study and the work in the notebook "Professional Medical Vocabulary in English".

The semester credit is evaluated on a two-point scale (passed/not passed) and a 200-point scale by determining the arithmetic mean of current grades for each practical lesson on a 4-point scale, and its subsequent conversion to 200-point scale. The minimum number of points that a student must score is 120.

The final control of knowledge in the discipline is carried out in the form of a test in the first semester and an exam in the second.

The test is a form of final control, which consists in assessing the student's mastery of the educational





material solely on the basis of the results of his/her performance of certain types of work in practical, seminar or laboratory classes. A semester test in a discipline is conducted after the end of its study, before the start of the examination session.

The exam is a form of final control of the student's mastery of theoretical and practical material in the discipline.

Students who have completed all types of work, tasks provided for in the curriculum for the semester in accordance with the discipline, attended all classes provided for in the curriculum, written and submitted a medical history and have an average score for current academic activities of at least "3" (72 points on a 120-point scale) are admitted to the semester final control. https://ieu.edu.ua/docs/rate-of-study.pdf

### 10 Discipline Policy

To activate the educational and cognitive activity of students in the study of the discipline, problematic lectures, presentations, cases, work in small groups

I will never allow statements that humiliate the honor and dignity of students, nor will I use coarse language towards them.

Policy for missing classes and completing assignments after the deadline

A student who, for valid reasons, confirmed by documentary evidence, was not subject to current control has the right to undergo current control within two weeks after returning to study.

A student who was absent from classes without valid reasons, did not participate in current control activities, did not eliminate academic debt, is not allowed to take the final semester control of knowledge in this discipline, and on the day of the exam, the academic staff member assigns a grade of "not admitted" in the examination record.
