Brief summary of the discipline

The discipline "Ukrainian language (for professional purposes)" is a practical embodiment of the totality of knowledge and skills that form the profile of a specialist in the field of medicine. The study of the discipline provides the necessary practical skills, without which the work of modern specialists is impossible. Knowledge of the discipline provides an opportunity to improve the quality of perception and operation of the necessary professional terminology.

² Purpose and objectives of the discipline

The purpose of teaching the discipline "Ukrainian Language (for Professional Purposes)" is to continue the formation of a national and linguistic personality, communication skills of future specialists, studying the features of the professional language. The main objectives of the discipline "Ukrainian Language (for Specific Purposes)" are to master the basic concepts of the course "Ukrainian Language (for Specific Purposes)"; to understand the importance of the state language in professional communication; to master the basics of the professional language of a doctor; to master the norms of medical documents. The main objectives of the discipline "Ukrainian Language (for Professional Purposes)" are: to teach students to independently navigate, analyse and adhere to the norms of modern Ukrainian professional speech; to develop skills and abilities to use medical terminology correctly in oral and written speech, to edit texts of scientific style of medical direction, to compile medical documentation; to promote the development of abilities for self-education and self-improvement, conscious and fluent command of the state language in professional activities

Individual tasks

Individual assignments are one of the forms of organising learning in higher education institutions, which aims to deepen, generalise and consolidate the knowledge that students receive in the course of their studies, as well as to apply this knowledge in practice. Individual tasks are performed by students independently under the guidance of a teacher.

7 Teaching methods

According to the sources of knowledge, teaching methods are used: verbal - narration, explanation, lecture. 1. Methods of organising and implementing educational and cognitive activities (explanatory and illustrative; reproductive)

2. Methods of stimulating and motivating learning and cognitive activity (problem-based presentation; partially search);

3. Methods of control and self-control over the effectiveness of educational and cognitive activity of master's students.

8 Control methods

Preliminary control (diagnostics of the initial level of students' knowledge): individual questioning, frontal questioning, testing, written control and self-control; current control (diagnostics of the quality of students' learning on specific topics and content modules): individual questioning, frontal questioning, testing, written control and self-control; final control (general diagnostics of the quality of students' knowledge and skills).

₉ Form of final control of progress

1. Attendance at classes is mandatory. For objective reasons (e.g. illness, international internship), training can take place individually (online in agreement with the dean of the faculty). Attendance at classes (lectures, practical, seminars, laboratories) is not evaluated in points.

2. Essays, term papers and other creative and scientific works must not contain plagiarism or compilation. Any citation must be accompanied by references to the literature used. Papers that contain plagiarism or compilation will not be accepted and will not be graded.

Cheating during tests and examinations is prohibited (including using mobile devices). Cheated papers will not be accepted or graded.

3. Assessment of students' knowledge is based on the results of current and final examinations. The final grade is the sum of the points gained during the current and final examinations and is calculated on a 100-point ECTS scale.

3.2. The final grade for the semester consists of grades for the study of lecture material, work in seminars/practical classes, demonstrated in completed tasks submitted for independent study, the degree of mastery of the discipline and current control (tests, colloquia, etc.).
